Today **mywaterworld.life** looks back at the New South Wales Masters Swimming Championships which were held on the weekend of, 10 and 11 April 2021 at the Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre, home of the 2000 Olympics.

Once again, the outstanding swims at a State Championship meet were by Victorian masters' swimmer John Cocks, from the Victorian Malvern Masters Swimming Club.

John followed up his two world records swims at the Tasmanian Championships by adding another two FINA World Records to his 2021 tally. This time **John's FINA world record\* breaking swims were in the 200m Breaststroke and 100m Butterfly events** in the 85–89-year age group. In the 200m Breaststroke John set the new world record mark with a time of 3:58.55 while in the 100m Butterfly John's time was 1:50.27

**Five Australian records were broken at this meet.** Two were broken by **John Cocks (85)** in the 100m Butterfly and 200 Breaststroke, **Paul Wyatt (75)** and **Stuart Mears (60)** in their 200M Individual Medley events and **Alan Brown (75)** in the 50 Freestyle.

The top swim by a member of an NSW club at the championships was by Alan Brown with 882 FINA points in the 75-79-year age group 50m Freestyle in a time of 30.97 **Stuart Ellicott** and **Paul Wyatt** both featured twice in the top ten swims.

There were 16 swims at the championships with FINA scores over 700 points. **Stuart Ellicott's** swims are noteworthy as he is in the last year of his age group while **Bec Pearse** is in her 4<sup>th</sup> and **Brandon Fraser** is in his third.

**Based on FINA points**, and restricted to members of NSW clubs, **the Swimmers of the Meet\*\* were Aaron Cleland** with total points of 3,389 **and Bec Pearse** with 3,242 points. Their average points per swim were 678 and 648 respectively.

The club, whose members at the meet recorded the highest average FINA points per swim was North Shore Masters with an average of 545 points.

**Eight NSW members broke a total of 11 NSW individual records** – 9 by the men and 2 by the women.

**Aaron Cleland (45) topped the record-breaking table** with three NSW records in the 50m, 100m and 200m Breaststroke events. **Paul Wyatt (75)** was the other multiple record breaker in the 200m IM and 100m Butterfly events.
