A look at the Masters Swimming Tamanian 2023 Summer Championships

A smaller than traditional number of Masters Swimming Tasmania members competed at their 39th Summer Championships Their numbers, and the competition was bolstered by a high-quality contingent of Victorian members.

The outstanding swim, with the highest individual World Aquatics (W-A) point score of 995 at the meet, was by Jennie Bucknell of the Victorian Powerpoints Masters Swimming Club (MSC) club. The swim was just ten one hundredths of a second off the current world record. Jennie smashed the Australian Women 100m freestyle event¹ in the 55–59 year age group taking 1.21 seconds off the Australian record in a swim of 1:02.12. Jennie had set the previous record just one week earlier. Jennie also broke the Australian 200m freestyle record, previously held by Jenny Whiteley.

Four Australian records were broken by Rod Laurie - 200m and 400 m Individual Medley and the 200m and 50m Butterfly events. [Table 2]

The Tasmanian Swimmers of the meet were Amanda Duggan, representing the Hobart Dolphins MSC and Maciej Slugocki from the Tomatoes MSC who also recorded, the highest World Aquatics points averaged over five swims.

A total of 27 Tasmanian Records were broken during the championships [Table 1]. **The top record breaker of the meet was Brent Waker** with new marks in the 50m, 100m and 200m Butterfly, 100m Freestyle and 50m Backstroke events.

A total of **8 Victorian individual records were broken**. Rod Laurie topped the Victorian list [Table 4] with 5 records, followed by Jennie Bucknell with 2 and Rosa Montague with 1.

The top ten Tasmanian swims were shared by Amanda Duggan with three, Christine Brown, Brent Walker and Maciej Slugocki with 2 each and Gabrielle Osborne with 1. **The average W-A points for these top ten swims were 735 with only one athlete, Amanda Duggan, scoring over 800 W-A points** with her 200m freestyle time of 2:31.73

In comparison, the Average W-A points of the top ten swims by Victorian athletes was 876, significantly ahead of the Tasmanians.

The Hobart Dolphins MSC were crowned the Champion club at the meet. Hobart Dolphins' club members strongly supported the championship meet and deservedly won the trophy.

The best indicator of the quality of performances at the championships however are the W-A points which are calculated for every World Aquatics event result. **mywaterworld.life** has done an analysis of the standards of swimming across the clubs that competed at the Tasmanian Summer Championships using W-A point scores as the basis of comparison. A minimum number of 5 athletes competing per club was the threshold for consideration.



The highest average points per swim were gained by members of the Hobart Aquatic Centre MSC – 487 points overall, 483 for the females and 497 for the males. [Tables 6, 7 and 8]. In second place in both the overall and female categories was the Devonport MSC.

Requiring a participation of at least five athletes means that three clubs were excluded from the comparison. Had not this threshold been in place, the overall table would have been topped by the Tomatoes MSC with an average of 618 W-A points with the Van Diemans MSC (the virtual club) with 582 points.

And finally, we turn to examine the standard from the stroke and event perspectives.

The lack of depth in results is driven by the small numbers of athletes participating in a large number of events (50m,100m and 200m in all strokes plus two medleys and a 400 freestyle, all across two genders and 8 or so age groups). Over 120 of the individual events contested had only one athlete participating and only two in another 40-plus events. The two most hotly contested events with 6 athletes participating were the Women's 60-64, 50 Freestyle and the Men's 70-74, 100 Freestyle. In a further 5 events there were 5 athletes competing.

The distance scoring the highest average W-A points was 400m covering both Individual Medley and Freestyle while the stroke was Butterfly with 401 points.

Not even in one event did the average W-A points exceed 500. The highest average was in the 100m Men's Butterfly where the average W-A point score was 495. [Table 11]
